

Thank you for your interest in the Internship in Science and Health Research and Training (ISHTaR) Program. This paid internship is designed and supervised by Ms. Julianne Cyr (jcyr@med.unc.edu), Research Instructor at UNC-CH Department of Emergency Medicine. If you feel you are the right fit for this internship, please answer the following questions and submit the following documents to Mr. Iuri Felix (iuri_felix@med.unc.edu), Research Assistant, UNC-CH Department of Emergency Medicine, no later than **March 18th, 2023**.

Questions:

- Will you be at least 16 years of age by June 19th, 2023?
- What year are you in school **right now**? (e.g., sophomore, junior, senior)
- What high school do you currently attend?
- How did you learn about the ISHTaR Program?
- Do you have reliable transportation to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill for work activities? (e.g., bus access, a car, a reliable carpool)
- Are you willing and able to work at least 20 hours a week? (Please note that all interns are required to work between 20-40 hours/week on average. We understand that interns may participate in other activities outside of work.)
- What jobs or other obligations will you have during the summer of 2023? (This may include extracurricular activities, camps, classes, or family responsibilities. Engagement in other opportunities is highly encouraged and does not impact your application.)

Documents:

- Submit a cover letter, no longer than one single-spaced page, telling us why you are a great match for the ISHTaR Program and how it would benefit your future career path.
- Submit a resume including your school, work, research, volunteer, and extracurricular activities, no longer than one single-spaced page. We understand not all applicants will have prior work experience.
- Submit a one-page Letter of Recommendation (LOR), from a former or current employer, teacher, counselor, or mentor describing your qualities and why you would be an asset to the ISHTaR Program. Letters of Recommendation should not come from family members or caregivers.
