Organization: Durham County Point of Entry (Dept. of Social Services)

Purpose: Emergency Shelter Assistance

Information: All emergency housing providers will continue offering their normal services. Urban Ministries will be implementing additional health screen procedures to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Anybody in need of shelter is encourage to go through Entry Point first — be prepared for additional screening procedures. Families Moving Forward is still accepting new residents if spots are available, but only residents and staff are allowed in and out of the building. The Durham Rescue Mission is currently accepting new check-ins between the hours of 12:00 PM—5:00 PM seven days a week. Prospective clients will be going through enhanced screening before being allowed in the Rescue Mission. Coordinated entry is the process by which everyone, whether single or with children, can get placed in an emergency shelter (Urban Ministries or Families Moving Forward) or have access to eviction diversion resources which include diversion counseling and financial assistance.
