

Meeting began at 5:35pm.

Mrs. Joyner-Ricci apologized for not having a paper copy of the agenda, and hoped that everyone enjoyed their Winter Break.

Ms. Raphael forgot that she was to recap our last SIT meeting.

Nothing new from the PTSA, said Mr. Wilkes.

Dr. Chisnall said:

- 2nd semester Saturday classes with faculty being compensated for students that are on track to graduate will be offered
- DPS may not be offering free summer school classes so Dr. Chisnall reminds students that they can either pass now or pay \$300 for the summer class
- Tardies are still an issue and that Hall Sweeps will soon be implemented because tardy students are not in the classroom learning and possibly causing others to not learn – various consequences will be developed for constant tardies.
- Senior meetings are still happening to keep them on track to graduate.
- Tomorrow, a meeting is being held to discuss the 10th and 11th graders that can possibly graduate on time.
- Some teachers are not getting enough grades into Powerschool on time which is frustrating to counselors because at one time, the grade was a passing grade for the student then when grades go in later, the student is not passing the class – parents, students, and counselors are not able to properly monitor the students' progress. Dr. Hyman mentioned about the possibility that more grades are given at the end, but then Mrs. Joyner-Ricci mentioned that her students have said that the problem is they have completed an assignment but they will not see the grade in Powerschool until the end of the grading period – not giving enough time to possibly make a higher grade.
- Math I tutoring is now being offered – starting next week and ending in May – Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 2:45pm to 3:45pm

Mr. Boyce said:

- Student led beautification projects are in process. However, it is too dark to see tonight but again a great job done by the students.
- The courtyard/patio area has finally been cleaned up and it too looks great – so much better.
- NC Beautiful grant was completed by Mrs. Joyner-Ricci and a parent: \$1000 to \$5000 – will hear back later when we know what we have received.
- Mr. Sterling, Megan Carol, and Mr. James did a walk around the campus to see about erosion here at campus. Mr. Dupry is very interested in how the students will be a major part of how this erosion and beautification (OCS classes) process will occur.

- Megan Carol planted about 40 trees on our campus – Mr. Lloyd, Mrs. Foxman, and other teachers' classes assisted with this beautification process. Therefore, walking our campus during the daytime is when these successful projects can be seen.
- Dr. Rooney and Mrs. Joyner-Ricci's classes helped us obtain bushes from other companies – 400 building is where those can be found.
- Creating a maintenance plan by students – OCS curriculum – to become a part of the Honor Society.
- When the solar panels come to Jordan, we will be able to add that to our curriculum and water conservation piece. Dr. Chisnall mentioned that here at Jordan, we are trying to both implement conservation and beautification projects. Also, a student painted a beautiful mural of a falcon. Signs are soon coming to both beautify the campus and promote school pride. Faith Jones asked that more be done to please

Ms. Kelly from Student Services:

- Freshman Academy lists are being developed for students that are failing 3 or more classes. Parent meetings – at least 40 – have been held, thus far. An academic contract is signed to encourage them to do better. 2nd Quarter: meeting with the student individually since parent meetings have already been held.
- Upper Classmen: student success meetings, pep talks instead of more negative talks (why aren't you doing this, that, etc), counselors are making phone calls home, Saturday School is being offered, field trip to the local community colleges for those on the 22 credit course.

Ms. Teri Williams:

- Mid-Term/Year Assessment from the District will be given at the end of January for the EOC classes (Case 21 program) that will be shared with parents and students – not just the teachers.
- All 9th and 10th graders will be tested for English and Math (I-Ready scores), again shared with parents and students.
- January Early Release meeting date is in-school
- February will be a District led PLC month

Mrs. Joyner-Ricci:

- The development of Sub-Committees: Graduation Committee (Goal 1), Attendance Committee (Goal 2), Culture/Teacher Retention Committee (Goal 2), Academic Growth Committee (Goal 3 but also Goal 2 because of suspension data).
