

Agenda was not emailed to us, so that explains why it is not included in these minutes, at the end.

Meeting began at 5:36pm.

Reading of the minutes: Ms. Raphael read the minutes from the previous meeting (not our regularly scheduled meeting date) and they were accepted and passed.

PTSA Report: Mr. Wilkes said it is Teacher Appreciation Week and the parents LOVE the teachers.

Principal's Report: The final Exam schedule has been posted on the Jordan website. We are in desperate need of proctors for this exam schedule – call Chisnall or Annas. Seniors test 2 days earlier than the rest of the school. Band event and the band is spending \$50,000 on new uniforms. Dr. LaCosse and Chisnall were present at the Board Meeting. Our student won the Student of the Month and had dinner with the Board and Dr. LaCosse introduced the rocket group, at the Board meeting – White House and NASA rocket event. Dance show, honoring the administrative assistants, and now this week is the teacher appreciation week. Saturday Recovery Academy – now down to 75 because they have not maintained the criteria for the program, from 95. Signing in and then leaving, not continuing to go to their classes, etc. AP tests have begun today – thanks to the church for their assistance – until May 13. Work Key results – 71% last year and this year is 79%. Our school has had some serious participation rates for testing – not meeting the 95% and that has been a problem. We exceeded it for ACT and for Work Keys. Question was asked about less than the 95% - Chisnall said there has to be a plan to makeup the tests and admin going into classes to pull out the kids to test.

Boyce: HVAC system needed to be replaced and the school has had a problem with reaching comfortable temperatures in the building. Contractors are still coming out and there is still leaking from the unit, with rooms being too cool and too hot – not conducive for learning. Other buildings run on other units right now, but the main building is having this problem. Question asked – budget cuts will affect this issue of the HVAC. Boyce addressed that we just don't know what will happen. Positives are: Mike Dupree and his associates will hopefully put 3 rain gardens here at Jordan by the 300, 400, and the 500 buildings – assisting with this task are some of our students and others come from other schools in the district. Teachers want to tie units and lessons plans in with this project. Near the solar panels – rain gardens will continue to add to our school. Boyce asked Mr. Wilkes if there was anything new about the solar panel – he was not aware of this. Four new trailers will be added, restroom, and covered walk way – we have more than 4 floating teachers on this campus now, so the 4 new trailers will help – not solve our problem. Baseball wants to improve their facilities, and they are receiving opposition to environmentalists. The conversation was discussed concerning the difference between adding the new trailers vs the baseball addition. Can we get more copiers since our enrollment has increased – answer is budget. Also, when testing comes around, can we get the air fixed because during testing it is extremely hot and fans need to be supplied. Will more be done to the restrooms besides the painting – plumbing issues need to be addressed/sent to Boyce and Sterling because some plumbing issues are not as visible and when the problem is discovered, it may be too late... Most restrooms have multiple toilets not working properly.

Parent Co-Chair: Mr. Hirsch accepted the nomination and it was accepted and passed.

2017-2018 traditional schedule discussion: Thanksgiving stays the same; winter break is different; getting out of school is also different; Spring Break was different; teacher workdays are different – perhaps an error on draft A? What types of feedback were they looking for? – concerns and preferences of which draft would we prefer? Calendar B was chosen from the SIT – we did have 1 member who preferred calendar A.

Future SIT meetings: June is not a needed meeting, because nothing new would be discussed. August meeting, tentatively scheduled for 8-22-16 at 5:30pm, because 8-15-16 is NOT a teacher workday. Then our 1st meeting in September would be the 12th because we are off at Labor Day which then allows us to go back to the 1st Monday of each month in October.
