August-November

- Maintain a folder specifically for financial aid/scholarships.
- Meet with School Counselor to discuss scholarship opportunities
- Begin scholarship search.

November –December

• Apply for a PIN (pin.ed.gov) to start preparing to complete FAFSA.

January

- File the FAFSA.
- Parents should prepare income tax as soon as they receive their W-2's (If parents are unable to complete taxes before March 1, please use estimates and update FAFSA with correct figures once taxes are filed.)
- Notify the school's financial aid office of any special circumstances.

February

• Complete CSS Profile, only select colleges require it. Contact the school's financial aid office to verify.

March

- Complete FAFSA and/or CSS Profile by March 1.
- Submit any additional forms or documentation required by financial aid office.

March-April

- Begin reviewing financial aid award letters.
- Compare awards to make the best decision for you and your family.
- Decide which college to attend based upon how it will meet your academic and financial needs.
- Remember you do not have to accept all the financial aid your school offers.

May-September

• If needed, apply for supplemental financial aid.
