

Recommending Students for Standard vs. Honors Level for English I, II, III, and IV

<p>Students with a consistent A average and student or parent interest in Honors will be recommended for Honors. Otherwise, the students are recommended for Standard.</p> <p>Exception: With current 8th and 9th grade students (rising 9th and 10th grade students), some recommendations are made on a case by case basis. Factors such as performance on the more difficult assignments, a pattern of improvement vs. a pattern of decline, work ethic, and extenuating circumstances will be considered.</p>	<p>Students with a consistent A or B average will be recommended for Honors.</p> <p>Students with a consistent D or failing average will be recommended for Standard.</p> <p>Students with a consistent C average or with erratic grades (a B one quarter and an F the next, etc.) will be recommended for Standard or Honors on a case by case basis. Factors such as performance on the more difficult assignments, a pattern of improvement vs. a pattern of decline, work ethic, and extenuating circumstances will be considered.</p>	<p>Students with a consistent A average will be recommended for AP, and students with a consistent B average will sometimes be recommended for AP.*</p> <p>Some students with a B average* and students with a consistent C or D average will be recommended for Honors.</p> <p>Students with a consistent failing average will be recommended for Standard.</p> <p>Further, students will be counseled on a case by case basis based on what they want to do when they leave DSA and how many AP classes they plan to take next year.</p> <p><i>*For more details, see the document outlining requirements for being recommended for AP English IV.</i></p>
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
