When taking AP English III as a 10<sup>th</sup> grader and AP English IV as an 11<sup>th</sup> grader, no alternative texts will be provided to address this concern; the College Board deems these classes to be equivalent to the coursework a college freshman would complete.</p>

<p>Honors Creative Writing III</p>	<p>Students who select this option would take this accelerated version of the course even if the usual prerequisites haven't been taken.</p>
<p>Honors Newspaper Journalism</p>	<p>Students who select this option would take this accelerated version of the course even if the usual prerequisites haven't been taken.</p> <p>Recommendation from an English teacher or Journalism teacher would be required.</p>
<p>Alternative Academic Class</p>	<p>Students may use their Choice Year to explore an interest in an academic subject area of their choosing (social studies, science, etc.).</p>
<p>Alternative Arts Class</p>	<p>Students could discuss this option with their counselor during course registration.</p>
